Civil War Book Discussion

Sunday, Feb. 8, 1 p.m. at Foundation House – Free.



Across Five Aprils, by Jasper County author Irene Hunt, covers a local family's involvement in the Civil War. We will also discuss how residents of Sainte Marie served in the war.

Presenter **Mike Hartrich**, (at left) Foundation vice president and co-curator of the military exhibit, is a retired history and English teacher and former athletic director at Newton

Community High School. (The book is widely available on Amazon or at your local library.) *Come, even if you have not read the book, as it will be an informative afternoon, with a chance to see the military exhibit.*

Vietnam: An Army Aviator's Perspective

Sunday, May 31, 2015 - 2 p.m. (Last day for Military Exhibit at the Museum, open from 11:30 – 1:30 p.m.)

Former resident **Ken Stone** will talk about his experiences in the Vietnam War, including some of

the significant actions in which he was involved during his tours of duty in 1962-63 and 1966-67, when he was a command pilot for the commander of the 1st Infantry Division. Ken's service in the Army included nine years of active duty, mainly flying army reconnaissance planes. He retired as a "bird colonel" after 20 years of service and went on to become a professor of economics at Iowa State University.

This is a joint program with the Ste. Marie American Legion, Auxiliary and Sons of the American Legion. **Ken Stone's 2 p.m. talk will be at the American Legion Hall, Ste. Marie, (with wine/cheese reception following talk.)** Donations accepted.

Ste. Marie in Enterprise Zone

Mayor Jack Thompson recently announced that the village is now part of the Jasper County Enterprise Zone, a joint venture with the city of Newton and Jasper County. The six-square-mile zone will welcome new businesses by abating their taxes for five years. For example, in the first year a business would pay no village or county taxes. The second year, only 20% of the taxes would have to be paid and so on until in the fifth year, full taxes would be paid.

“We want to encourage new businesses to locate here,” says Thompson, “and this is one way to do so.”

Nick Reis Receives Honors

Newton Community High School senior, **Nicholas Reis**, son of State Representative **David and Maria Reis**, Ste. Marie, was recently named to the *Illinois High School Football Coaches Association Class 3-A Academic All-State Team*.



To be named to the IHSFCA academic squad, a player had to be selected as an *All-Conference player* and had to have a current cumulative grade point average of 3.5 or better on a 4.0 scale, or 4.5 or better on a 5.0 scale.

On the field, Nicholas was a three year Letterman on the offensive line at Newton and was named **First Team All-Conference and Decatur Herald First Team All-Area** for the 2014 season. Defensively, the 6'0" 280-pounder also played on the line for the Eagles who qualified for the Class 3-A playoffs for the first time in seven years. Nick was also selected to play in the *Shriners All-Star Game* to be held June 20, 2015, in Bloomington, IL. Congratulations, Nick, and good luck in your university football career!

The **Sainte Marie Foundation's Flower Basket** Project has been very popular since it first started in 2010. People living in and traveling through Sainte Marie enjoy the beautiful baskets during the spring, summer and early-fall months.

Many of you have graciously helped with this project in the past, and we were wondering if you would like to help once again to sponsor the 2015 Flower Basket Project. Plans need to be made early. The plants for the baskets are started in a greenhouse after the first of the year and are planted in the baskets in March. They grow in an Amish greenhouse north of Oblong until the baskets are hung sometime in May. In the early years of this project, we charged only one hundred dollars to sponsor one of the 14 flower baskets. Our actual costs turned out to be much more, but rather than charging more per basket, we have allowed more people to sign up as sponsors in order to help with the overall costs of the baskets. Each donor (individual or business) is listed on professionally made signs (also an expense) displayed on the old bank's windows. We also list "*In memory of*" or "*In honor of*" your loved one, if you prefer that kind of donation.
